"I Pink I Can" by Annie Young

Annie Young's "I Pink I Can"

Walking into the artist reception for Annie Young's exhibit at the Ames Center, you could hear many voices in a people filled gallery that spilled over into the hallway as live gentle guitar music played in the background. The walls of the gallery were filled with an explosion of color with flowers popping off the walls, trees, dragon flies and much more.

As I walked by a pillar with a beautiful cloth basket, a young man asked me if I would like to write a note to



firefighters and police thanking them. I put my note in the basket thinking how lovely it was that Annie would be thinking of others and provide a gratitude basket at her event.

About 80 paintings are in this show, many of them large works with layers of color creating rich textures that delight the eyes. Annie may have lost her sight, but her vision shines off the walls.

I meandered out into the hallway where three more paintings sat on easels. In the gallery, the paintings were labeled "do not touch". A young man was standing by the paintings in the hallway and invited me to touch them, saying that the Ames were concerned about touching the work in the gallery, but that Annie creates them by touch and wanted others to feel what she feels.

He told me that his mom is Annie's friend and that his dad is a blue collar guy that usually is not a fan of art. He described one of Annie's paintings in the gallery that had a lot of grey with one red spot and she calls that painting Ghetto like the song. He said that his dad was very emotionally moved by that work of art.

I went back into the gallery to be able to get closer to some of the art that had too many viewers when I was there before. A woman came up to me and said that a large purple flower painting was hers. She told me she had had breast cancer and that Annie painted that painting for her, and that it touched her very powerfully in a way that words could not. I thanked her for telling me.

An important part of this art experience was reading the names of Annie's paintings. One called "I Pink I can" and all of them expressive of feelings, life choices and experience. The young man who invited me to touch the paintings in the hall, also said "never tell Annie she can't do something." An inspirational message we can all benefit from. Her work lifts the spirit.
